
Confessions of a Hydrogeologist

Kamini Singha is a witch! – a modern *water witch* who uses a combination of geological sciences and high tech geophysics to find water deep in the ground. The aquifers she explores are the primary source of most of the water we use for drinking, cooking, washing, farming, and industry. Her science also detects pollution in our water supplies and devises efficient ways to clean up contamination.

Dr. Singha lives an excitingly diverse life, not only doing fundamental research, publishing four highly technical scientific papers every year, and teaching courses, but also volunteering her time with Engineers Without Borders to help impoverished communities get vital water resources! She is an active member of the American Geophysical Union, the Geological Society of America, International Association of Hydrogeologists, and Engineers Without Borders.

Dr. Singha will speak to the community to share stories of her experiences, traveling the world, doing research and helping communities.
