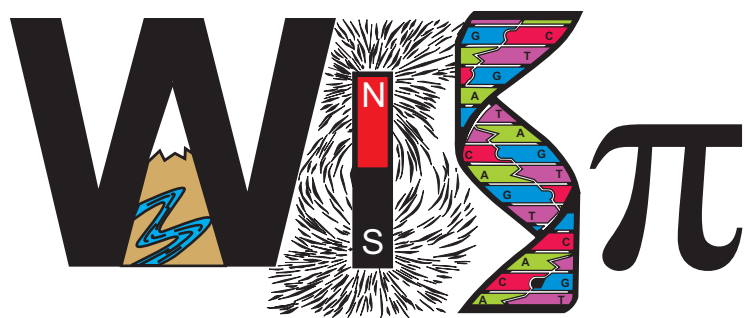
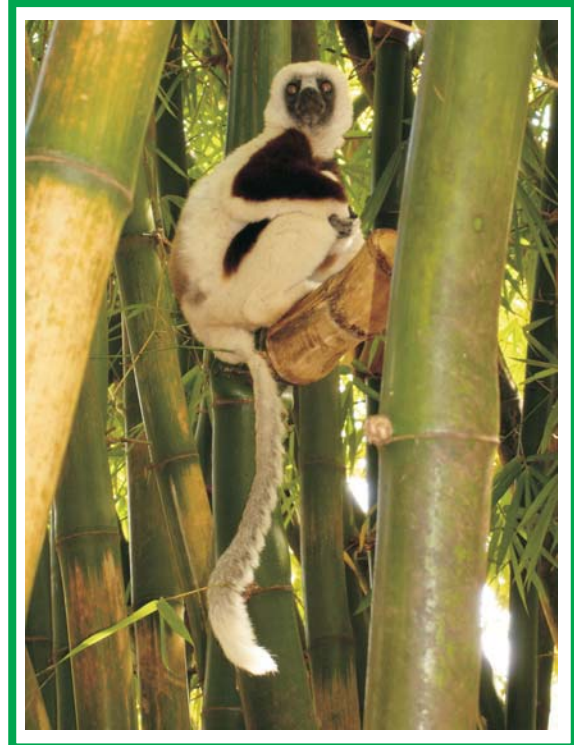
Dr. Rónadh Cox, Williams College

Rónadh Cox is a geologist who realized early on that the entire planet is made of rocks and dirt so you can go anywhere you like to study them. She works on gullies in Madagascar, cliff-top boulder ridges in Ireland, and reef sediments in the Caribbean. Having more recently realized that the Solar System is also made of rocks, she now also studies impact processes on Jupiter's moon Europa (although she has not yet managed to organized a field trip there). Born in Ireland, she now lives in rural Massachusetts with her husband (also a geologist) and son (who likes rocks and swinging hammers).

Rónadh will talk about cool rocks in awesome places, and about how great it is to spend your life touching and measuring (and occasionally whacking) the Earth, trying to solve some of its puzzles.
