

## Order of Notes in Bibliographic Records

Notes should generally be inserted in a bibliographical record in the order listed below. However, any note determined to be of primary importance should be placed first. See *AACR2 Revision 2002 7.7B*, for complete description and examples for the various formats.

- ✓ System requirements (MARC 538)\*
- ✓ Nature, scope or artistic form (MARC tag 500)
- ✓ Language information (MARC tag 546)
- ✓ Source of title proper (MARC tag 500)
- ✓ Statements of responsibility not included in primary statement of responsibility (MARC tag in this order : 500, 511, 508)
- ✓ Statement concerning edition and history (MARC tag 500)
  - Example: Originally produced as a motion picture in 1996.
- ✓ Material or type of publication details (MARC tag 500, 516)
- ✓ Additional physical description details (MARC tag 500)
- ✓ Accompanying material and supplements not mentioned in general physical description, (MARC tag 500, 525)
- ✓ Additional series information (MARC tag 500)
- ✓ Information relative to dissertations (MARC tag 502)
- ✓ Audience (MARC tag 500, 521)
- ✓ Availability of other formats (MARC tag 530)
- ✓ Summary of contents (MARC tag 520)
- ✓ Presence of bibliographical references (MARC tag 504)
- ✓ Index information (MARC tag 500, 504)
- ✓ Other content information (MARC tag 500)
- ✓ Table of Contents (MARC tag 505)
- ✓ Numbers associated with the item (MARC tag 500)
- ✓ “With” notes (MARC tag 501)
- ✓ Awards (MARC tag 586)
- ✓ Local notes (MARC tag 590)
- ✓ Date, time and place of event (MARC 518)

\* Not in AACR2, follows common practice and is considered most important note.
